A work to be performed.

A call.

“pray continually” ***1 Thess. 5:17***

Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened. ***Matthew 7:7***

The Principle of Abiding.

If Jesus said that he could do nothing apart from His father how Much more do we need to be in close fellowship with God through prayer?

Jesus gave them this answer: "I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does." **John 5:19**

Personal Prayer

Prayer requires a private place. Jesus made time to be alone for prayer. You do not always have to BE alone to pray, but we must make time to be alone to pray.

Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. **Matthew 14:22-23**

Yet the news about him spread all the more, so that crowds of people came to hear him and to be healed of their sicknesses. But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed. **Luke 5:15-16**

Close and continual fellowship with God will, in due time, leave it's mark and manifest itself to those around us.—*Sean Smith*

When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus. **Acts 4:13**

When Moses finished speaking to them, he put a veil over his face. But whenever he entered the LORD's presence to speak with him, he removed the veil until he came out.
